Re: Temporary Suspension of Peak Hour Restrictions Related to Longer Combination Vehicles due to Impacts of COVID-19

To Whom it May Concern:

On Monday, March 30, 2020, the Colorado Transportation Commission in Special Session passed a resolution which suspended the rule in state law that prohibits travel by longer combination vehicles (LCVS) during peak time periods (7:00 AM to 9:00 AM) and (4:00 PM to 6:00 PM) for the urban areas of Denver, Colorado Springs, and Pueblo.

The Commission acted on suspending the rule as they viewed it essential to move medical supplies, food, and other supplies in the most expeditious manner possible at this time of crisis. The Commission also recognized that traffic on our highways has substantially dropped at this time which will allow for the safe travel of these vehicles while also not impeding traffic flow.

The suspension of the rule concerning peak period travel by LCVs is in place for the next 120 days.
